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at FABW are organised in blocks, rather than in a repeating weekly schedule. This makes room for students to choose individual blocks throughout the term. The choice of these blocks has to be approved by the International Office, optional courses may not interfere with compulsory classes in the ICLA track.

Who Can Apply?

Candidates for ICLA are

- **BA Graduates or Experienced Students:** With at least two years of intensive training in film and media.
- Currently Enrolled: In one of FABW's partner institutions
- **Open-Minded Personalities:** Prepared to work with peers from diverse backgrounds and perspectives
- **Prepared for Interdisciplinary Training:** Looking to learn beyond their core department
- Minimum Age Requirement: 23 years
- **Proficiency in English** at B2 level

Academic Credits

Throughout the semester, participants have access to classes of at least 300 contact hours. Credits may be transferred according to the systems of their respective home institution, i.e.

- Semester Credit Hours (SCH): Typically, 1 SCH is equivalent to 15 contact hours.
- **Quarter Credit Hours (QCH):** Typically, 1 QCH is equivalent to 10 contact hours.
- **Carnegie Units (CU):** Typically, 1 CU is equivalent to 120 contact hours.

Please speak to your home institution beforehand to ensure that academic credits earned at FABW will be counted as academic records.

Practical Information

No Tuition Fee

No tuition fee will be charged, on the basis of reciprocal student exchange. However, an administration fee (approximately 130€/semester) is mandatory, including benefits such as insurances, reduced prices for meals in the cafeteria, free public transportation.

Housing

Filmakademie optionally arranges rooms for students in a nearby student hall of residence. Participants may rent their own rooms elsewhere, but due to a general shortness of alternatives, it is highly recommended to rent a room in the dorm.

Health Insurance

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All participants must prove a valid health insurance which covers the whole duration of their stay at FABW. Without proof, access to the school's facilities will not be possible.
